Veteran Suicide Prevention Care Expansion: VA has announced that as of Jan. 17, any veteran experiencing a suicidal crisis may receive emergency care at no cost from any VA or non-VA health care facility. Enrollment in the VA system is not required. "Veterans in suicidal crisis can now receive the free, world-class emergency health care they deserve – no matter where they need it, when they need it, or whether they're enrolled in VA care," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "This expansion of care will save Veterans' lives, and there's nothing more important than that." This benefit includes inpatient or crisis care for up to 30 days, and outpatient care for up to 90 days. <u>Read more</u>.

988 Veterans Crisis Hotline: Veterans now have the option to **Dial 988 then Press 1** to connect with caring, qualified responders for 24/7 crisis assistance. "During a crisis, every second counts," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "This new, shorter number makes it easier for veterans and those who care about them to reach lifesaving support without having to be enrolled in VA benefits or health care." While <u>Dial 988 then Press 1</u> is a new option for contacting the Veterans Crisis Line, the original number, 1-800-273-8255 and press 1, remains available, and individuals can make contact via chat at <u>VeteransCrisisLine.net/Chat</u> or by texting 838255.



Student Veteran Enrollment Verification: Students receiving Post-9/11 GI Bill housing payments are now required to verify enrollment to VA by the end of each month. Students may choose to text message verification to ensure seamless receipt of their Monthly Housing Allowance (MHA) payments. Learn more about the enrollment verification process.



MIA Update: The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced two burial updates and one new identification for service members who have been missing and unaccounted-for from World War II and Vietnam. Returning home for burial with full military honors are:

-- Army Pfc. Thomas F. Green, 19, of Ramona, California, was assigned to 68th Aviation Company, 52nd Aviation Battalion, 17th Aviation Group. On Oct. 26, 1971, he was serving as the door gunner on a CH-47B Chinook helicopter that went down over water in bad weather while flying from Tuy Hoa to Cam Ranh Bay in Vietnam. Green was not accounted for during search and rescue operations. He will be buried in his hometown on Feb. 23, 2023. <u>Read about</u> <u>Green</u>.

-- Army Air Forces Tech. Sgt. Harold Kretzer, 32, of Odin, Illinois, was assigned to 66th Bombardment Squadron, 44th Bombardment Group, 8th Air Force. On Aug. 1, 1943, the B-24 Liberator aircraft on which Kretzer was a gunner-engineer crashed as a result of anti-aircraft fire during Operation Tidal Wave. Following the war, his remains could not be identified. He will be buried in Springfield, Illinois, on a date yet to be determined. Read about Kretzer. -- Navy Aviation Ordnanceman 1st Class Anthony Di Petta, 24, was assigned to Navy Torpedo Squadron 20 aboard the USS Enterprise. On Sept. 10, 1944, the TBM-1C Avenger torpedo bomber on which Di Petta and two other crew members were serving crashed as a result of anti-aircraft fire near Malakal, Palau Islands. Efforts to recover his remains were unsuccessful. Interment services are pending. Read about Di Petta.
